NEWCOMER SETTLEMENT PROGRAM (NSP)

WEST staff work with newcomers in Windsor-Essex to help them settle and integrate into our community as well as the Canadian lifestyle.

Program Eligibility Requirements: Person who received

permission to stay in Canada for the purpose of becoming a Refugee Claimant, Visitor, Canadian Citizen, Minister's Permit holder. This program is funded by the Ontario Ministry of Citizenship and Immigration (MCI).

EMPLOYMENT SERVICE

Employment Service at WEST provides customized support to individuals to assist them with their job search efforts. Our well-trained team of Job Developers/Employment Counsellors provide oneone-one assistance for career exploration, job readiness, resume writing, interview preparation, and connection with employers. Placement opportunities with and without incentives are available. Additional supports are also available to clients facing financial barriers. Second Career application assistance is available to support laid off, unemployed individuals who require skills training to find employment in high-demand occupations. Services and grants are also available for employers in order to help them with their hiring and training needs. Throughout the pandemic, staff remained resilient and continued to provide seamless services through online platforms. During the spring and summer this year, more than 500 clients were serviced through workshops, job search assistance, job matching and one-on-one support.

WOMEN IN SKILLED TRADES (WIST)

On August 3rd, WEST welcomed 20 new women into our 8th Intake of CNC/Industrial Mechanic Millwright Pre-Apprenticeship Program (Women in Skilled Trades Program). All students received personal protective equipment and backpacks to get them started with their new career journey. This fully funded training program provides the knowledge and confidence they need to pursue careers in the skilled trades. Our goal is help women overcome barriers and gain employment without having prior knowledge and experience in the trades.

The students from the previous intake have also completed their in-class training portion and are ready to apply their skills in a real work environment through the work placements. Despite the challenges and interruptions imposed by the pandemic, the students remained resilient to complete their training. We wish them success as they continue their journey in skilled trades.

INTRODUCTION TO CONSTRUCTION AND CRAFT TRADES FOR WOMEN

WEST is delighted to offer new Introduction to Construction and Craft Trades for Women (ICCTW) program. This program is offered in partnership with Labourers' International Union of North America (LIUNA 625). The program is specifically designed to facilitate the entry of women without prior experience or knowledge to the Construction, Craft Worker and Cement (Concrete) Finisher Trades. This short-term training program will provide participants with basic knowledge and exposure to apprenticeship

training, help in gaining employment by bridging the gap with this sector specific skills training and ultimately leading the participants to the RED Seal designation in various apprenticeship sectors. We successfully completed the first intake and the second intake started on September 27th, 2021.

THE EMPOWERING WOMEN FOR EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM (EWE)

If you are a newcomer and are looking for a program to further develop your skills, build your confidence and increase your professional network. Then the EWE Program may be right for you.

The program includes 8-weeks of online training, followed by a 5-week work placement.

Eligible participant includes

- Permanent Residents or Convention Refugees, minimum of level 5 Canadian Language Benchmark, and minimum High School completion from Canada or outside Canada.
- Newcomer Women (Permanent Residents, Convention Refugees) with high school diploma for either in Canada or Outside of Canada and Language Proficiency CLB 5+.

This program is funded by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC).

SECOND CAREER

Second Career program assists laid off, or unemployed individuals wanting to develop new skills to find employment in high-demand occupations in Ontario. Eligible participants can receive up to \$28,000 to cover the costs for tuition, books, manuals, or other instructional costs, transportation, basic living allowance, and childcare.

This Employment Ontario is funded in part by the Government of Canada and the Government of Ontario.

COMPUTER TRAINING

Never before has it been so apparent that in order to successfully enter the workforce you must have computer skills, and be able to adapt to new technologies quickly and easily. WEST has been providing training opportunities to help participants gain those necessary skills, and the confidence to use them. Our programs range from introducing basic knowledge of computer hardware and commonly used computer applications, to online safety and computing in the cloud, as well as certification courses in Microsoft Office applications.

This year we added a new learning platform, Jasperactive, to help our students test out the skills they are learning and get instant feedback on how they are using their skills. This has helped clients improve their confidence in using and applying the skills that they are learning. WEST is continuously adapting to technology to meet the changing needs of program delivery due the COVID-19 pandemic, and we were able to successfully deliver these classes through virtual platforms.

EMPLOYER HUB

Why Not Us? Groundbreaking Collaborations in Creating Safe and Inclusive in Creating Safe and Inclusive Workplaces for Women

WEST recently got an opportunity to offer a professional development session at the Ontario Council of Agencies Serving Immigrants (OCASI). This interactive session told the story of how a newcomer and refugee provider agency became an agent for change and partner to a national groundbreaking project by Canadian Coalition of Women in Science, Engineering, Trades and Technology (CCWESTT) in creating powerful change for women in Canada. Session attendees learnt:

- How to shift perspective from "a provider of service" to "ideapreneur" using the "Why Not Us" notion and, create new opportunities to enable marginalized women to share experiences to leverage real changes in the workplace
- The reality and challenges for women in the skilled trades and the role employers play in preparing the workplace
- How to use a simple, step by step guide for employers on how to create safe and inclusive workplaces
- Discussion: Reflect on the learnings and to consider how to challenge themselves to think more like an "ideapreneur" and to unlock untapped possibilities for your organization using your expertise and data to be a thought leader and a contributor to national discussions


CHILD'S PLAY
